

PARALEGAL DAY SPEAKERS:

Connecticut Attorney General, Richard Blumenthal was first elected to serve as Connecticut's 23rd Attorney General in 1990, re-elected in 1994, 1998 and 2002. He acts as an advocate for consumers, the environment, children and the civil rights of Connecticut's citizens. Before being elected Attorney General, Mr. Blumenthal was a member of the Connecticut State Senate and the Connecticut House of Representatives. Mr. Blumenthal also served as U.S. Attorney for Connecticut from 1977 to 1991. He was a law clerk to Supreme Court Justice Harry A. Blackman and has served as volunteer counsel for the NAACP Legal Defense Fund. Attorney General Blumenthal graduated from Harvard College and Yale Law School.

Georgette Lovelace, R.P.® earned her Bachelor's degree in legal studies from Quinnipiac University in 1980 and has worked continuously as a Paralegal since then. She currently works in the litigation department at Susman, Duffy, & Segaloff, P.C. in New Haven. In 1981, Georgette was one of the founding members of the New Haven County Association of Paralegals (NHCAP). From 1981 through 2005 she served as NHCAP's president, treasurer, secretary, first VP, newsletter editor, and bylaws chair. Between 2002 and 2006 she served as one of NHCAP's delegates to the National Federation of Paralegal Associations (NFPA). In May 2006 she was elected Treasurer and Director of Finance of NFPA, serving for two and one-half years. She was elected President of NFPA in October 2008, and currently serves on the Legal Studies Advisory Committee for the University of New Haven.

Regina Barreca, Ph.D. is a professor of English Literature at the University of Connecticut. She received her B.A. from Dartmouth College, her M.A. from New Hall, Cambridge University and her Ph.D. from City University of New York. Her ability to elicit enthusiastic and dedicated writing from her students stems from her pedagogical style that combines wit, energy, and erudition with an ability to make students active participants in the classroom. She has served as an advisor to the Library of Congress for work on humor and the American character and has appeared on scores of radio and television programs, including *20/20*, *48 Hours*, *The Today Show*, and *Oprah*.

From New London:

Take I-91 South. Get Off Exit 51 (Frontage Road). At 3rd Traffic Light, take a Left onto Townsend Avenue. Then SEE BELOW

From Townsend Avenue:

Follow the signs to Lighthouse Park to Lighthouse Road. It is exactly 2.4 miles once you turn onto Townsend Avenue to the driveway entrance at Anthony's. You will go by the water on your right 1.5 miles down. Go to the light at the intersection of Lighthouse Road and Townsend Avenue and bear right. Anthony's Ocean View is 1/10th of a mile on the right hand side.

Deb Boyle, R.P. ® is the Program Manager and a Professor in the Paralegal Studies department at the University of Hartford. Deb also coordinates the internship program at the University. She graduated from Marist College with a Bachelor's degree in Communications and a minor in Legal Studies. Deb earned the PACE registered Paralegal designation in 1999. She also attended the University of Connecticut, receiving her Master's degree in Adult Education with honors in 2000. She worked as a practicing Paralegal in the greater Hartford area for 17 years in corporate and law firm settings as well as performing free lance work. Some of the Paralegal courses taught by Deb have included Legal Ethics, Introduction to Law, Title Searching and Technology. In addition, Deb has authored various articles which have been published both locally and nationally.

Dr. Jerry Labriola, After his first exposure to forensic medicine while serving in the U.S. Navy, Dr. Labriola practiced medicine for over 35 years and was an Assistant Professor at the University of Connecticut Medical School. A Yale graduate and former Chief of Staff at a major teaching hospital, he also served as state senator and ran for governor and the United States Senate.

Dr. Labriola writes full-time, is past president of the Connecticut Authors Association, member of the Mystery Writers of America (New York Chapter) and the International Association of Crime Writers. For the past three years he has been the keynote speaker at the forensic science workshop at Syracuse University. As an author and crime analyst, he lectures extensively on mystery, true crime, and forensic science issues, and conducts workshops on the elements of the novel with emphasis on mysteries.
